

Chawton House, near Alton in Hampshire, was known to Jane Austen as the 'Great House', as it was owned by her brother Edward. Jane lived in a cottage on his estate and would stroll up to 'dawdle away' many an hour in the grand Elizabethan manor and its picturesque gardens.

Today, the House, Gardens and Parkland are home to many treasures: an extensive collection of early women's writing; Austen heirlooms, such as the dining table at which Jane would have enjoyed family meals; and historic landscape features including a wilderness and a ha-ha. Whether your group's interests lie in Jane Austen and women's writing or historic houses and gardens, there is something for every visitor to Chawton House.



GARDEN TOUR (1 hour, 15 minutes)

Discover the beautiful gardens of Chawton House and learn the history of their transformation from the formal layout of the 17th century through to the restored English landscape style of the late 18th century. Your walk will take you from a pleasant garden terrace to a walled garden where you will hear the story of the Elizabeth Blackwell herb garden, then through the rambling wilderness to see the avenue of limes and the hidden ha-ha, and admire the changing views of the house and the landscape that so inspired Jane Austen.

House History Tour (1 hour, 15 minutes)

Learn how the estate has evolved over the years, was saved from Cromwell's destruction by a toddler, and in the following centuries provided a secure home for Jane Austen in one of its cottages. Discover the many captivating secrets of the 'Great House': spot the superstitious anti-witch marks on the 16th century fireplace; uncover a message in a bottle from a Victorian squire; search a painting for hidden Regency graffiti; and explore a fascinating collection of early women's writing in the library.

CURATOR'S TOUR (1 hour, 15 minutes)

Find out more about the unique collection of early women's writing held in the library at Chawton House by exploring the books, objects and their stories with one of Chawton House's curatorial team. There are two exhibitions at Chawton House each year and a number of smaller displays, with recent exhibitions including *Mary Robinson* (2024) and *Sisters of the Pen: Jane Austen, Influence, Legacy* (2025). Curator's tours will change according to the current exhibition, but will focus on the literary treasures of the house.

PARKING:

We can accommodate minibuses in our car park with prior notice. There is also disabled parking available. Coaches are not permitted to come up the drive to the turning circle. Coach and car parking is available on the local road, leading off the main entrance drive.
